Dear Ms Parkkunen,

I take great pleasure in confirming the redesignation of Baltic Region Healthy Cities Association, as a WHO Collaborating Centre for Healthy Cities and Urban Health in the Baltic Region.

The application for redesignation of the Centre was considered by the Regional Screening Committee and based on the performance of the Centre, review of reports and the future plan of work; the Committee has recommended a redesignation for a further period of four years as from the 28 February 2011. It is understood that you will continue as Head of the Centre.

A copy of the agreed Terms of Reference is enclosed. As you are aware a report of activities undertaken as a part of the agreed plan of work must be submitted annually. You will receive an email with a web link to an electronic reporting form which is used for this purpose.

The designation of the Institute as a WHO Collaborating Centre will automatically expire at the end of the designation period unless a subsequent Redesignation process is initiated. It is important to note that the redesignation process should commence at least six months prior to the end of the designation period. Either party may revoke the designation at any time by giving notice three months before the end of the year.
